

The results are published in our *Losing Ground* report series, providing conservationists, municipal officials, and agencies with information for planning and action. The sixth edition includes information on the value of undeveloped land in the context of a changing climate, as well as a natural Green Infrastructure map of lands most important to both ecological integrity and human communities.
